

Sport Premium Funding 2015/2016

Background Information

In March 2013 the government announced that it was to provide additional funding of **£150 million per annum** for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools in England - The **Primary PE & Sport Premium**.

This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - is allocated to Primary School Headteachers. The funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

In the Autumn Statement 2013, the Chancellor, George Osborne announced an additional year's £150m extended funding, taking the total investment to the end of the 2016 academic year.

On 6th February 2014 the Prime Minister, David Cameron committed to continue the funding for the Primary PE & Sport Premium until **2020**.

On the 17th July 2015 the Department for Education announced that 2015/6 funding will remain at the same level as last year.

Purpose of funding:

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and Sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Vision:

All pupils leaving primary school are physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

Objective:

- To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.

We would expect indicators of such improvement to include:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

- Increased participation in competitive sport

Impact of Sports Premium 2014/2015:

- All pupils from Year 1-6 have received outstanding PE and Sports teaching from specialist qualified sports teachers throughout the year.
- All pupils have been involved in an inter-school Sports Celebration Event. EYFS Sports Day and Year 2-6 World Championships sports day
- Dartmouth Academy entered more Inter School Sports fixtures in 2014-2015 than any other year.
- 52% of pupils have attended an after school sports club.
- 30% of pupils have represented the school in at least one inter school sport event.
- The school has hosted 4 inter-school sport festivals in the last year and reached its first ever area final in athletics.
- 90% of students have attended a lunch time sports club organised by trained sports leaders
- Healthy Lifestyles through physical activity have been explored in PE lessons.

Use of Sport Premium Funding 2015/2016

The Academy has received £_____ Sports Premium Funding for the year 2015/16.

The purpose of the funding is improve provision for, engagement and participation in sporting activity for pupils in order to encourage a healthy lifestyle.

Targets for 2015/2016:

- To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE teaching and sport.
- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- Raise the profile of PE and Sport across the school as a lever for whole school improvement
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport

Sports Funding used for	Objective and Specific intended outcomes
Inter School Sport Competitions	To provide the staff lead for PE and Sports time and resources to develop inter school provision including organising 6 Academies South West tournaments
Activities Enrichment TLR	To engage children in physical sports and activities during outside break times to aid healthy lifestyles, develop social skills, and provide a range of sports experiences and opportunities outside of the class room
Specialist PE Teaching	All teachers in Primary will have the opportunity to observe and team teach with specialist PE teachers for 1 hour a week.
After School Sports Provision Dance Coach	Provide funded afterschool sports clubs opportunities for pupils, removing potential barriers for pupil engagement and take up and increasing sports participation and healthy lifestyles for children.
Table Tennis and Netball equipment to begin new clubs	Purchase of equipment to introduce a new sport and extend after school sports clubs. New sports opportunity at Dartmouth Academy, broadening pupils' sporting experiences and utilising the school facilities.
Swimming training	To train in house staff to teach swimming lessons. This will be vital with the new swimming pool being built in Dartmouth and the opportunity for all year teaching
National Sports Week Events	Children will have opportunity to try sports they have not tried before. This will be promoted across Academies South West
